## Where your money goes

Did you ever wonder where your dues and donations go once you send them to Franklin High School Alumni Association?

The chart below shows a breakdown of income received through February of this year, which represents the first five months of our fiscal year. The FHSAA fiscal year runs from September 1st 2022 to August 31st 2023.

We separate funds into three categories: 1) Membership dues, 2) FHSAA Donations, and 3) School Donations.

Membership dues are used to run the organization. This includes functions such as Membership luncheons, FHSAA sponsored events and fundraisers, and communication to you in the form of our bi-annual newspaper. The creation, production and distribution of the newspaper takes up a large portion of this expense, \$9,000 each for our Fall and Spring issues. So far this year, Membership dues represents 19.36%

of the income received to date.

FHSAA Donations are funds received and designated by you as a donation to the Association that we can use where we feel it is needed most. Only a small portion of these funds are used to support the cost of running the organization, the majority is accrued over the year and used to fund grants to teacher programs. Each year, teachers have the opportunity to apply for grants from the Association through a grant process that we developed several years ago. The FHSAA Alumni Grant Committee reviews each grant and funds those that are in the best interest of the students and school. So far this year, FHSAA Donations represents 28.52% of the income received to date.

School Donations are funds received from you where you designate a specific program. This is the largest part of our program. 100% of these funds are sent directly to the program you designate on the donation form. Over fifty two percent

(52.12%) of all funds received so far this year have been designated as school donations. As you can see in the chart below, you support a variety of school programs. (Music-Band has an asterisk next to it because this program included one donation for over \$5,000 from a single donor for a specific request from the Band Teacher).

School donations are retained until the end of the school year and are made available to each program at the beginning of the following year. It provides a great jump-start to the teacher when planning the new year.

As a result of your generosity, each year the FHSAA has been able to supplement school programs, provide aid to students in need, and offer teacher grants that partially or fully fund extra projects or programs. All of this enhances student opportunities and their learning experiences at Franklin High School.

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# Franklin High School through the years

Founded in 1914, Franklin was Portland's fourth high school. The city's high schools were filled to capacity at the time, and the population in southeast Portland was rapidly growing. It was initially founded in part of the Creston elementary school, with nine instructors and 115 students in the spring 1914 semester. The current brick building opened in September 1917. It was designed by Floyd Naramore, who was known for his public school designs between World War I and the Great Depression.

In 1942, a statue of Benjamin Franklin, after whom the school was named, was installed outside of Franklin High School. The sculpture was one of two Works Progress Administration (WPA) projects benefitting Franklin between 1939 and 1942; the other was the construction of the school's athletic field. The statue was funded by Franklin alumni and students, who raised \$15,000 to commission an artist from the Federal Art Project, one of WPA's five independent branches. George Berry and his team of assistants created a 40-ton sandstone statue of Franklin, which was erected at the school's north entrance, overlooking the athletic field, in 1942. Including its pedestal, the work measures 15-foot (4.6 m) tall. The pedestal includes built-in benches and the inscription, "One today is worth two tomorrows."

Due to the baby boom and the passing of a \$25 million building levy by the school district in 1947, a new addition for arts, industrial arts, and home economics departments was slated.

In October 2010 the school decided to discontinue its competitive robotics team due to the lack of any school official sanctioning the team, allegedly by locking the team out of their workspace without access to their tools, or the more than \$7000 the team had raised to sustain the program. "The event made the headline news in THE BEE and drew anger from FIRST Robotic Teams around the world.

The team had been a part of the school for seven years. "Scrappy former FHS robotics team is still in existence and recently won the district competition. The nonprofit, FRC-sanctioned, after-school robotics club has remained active, since moving into the basement of Knights of Pythias Ivanhoe Lodge #1 in Lents, where it continues to this day". Between 2015 and 2017, the school was modernized and expanded, with funding from a \$482 million bond measure in 2012. The modernization included a new arts center, a new gym, biomedical, and culinary arts building, seismic retrofitting, and a new entrance. Franklin also underwent a very contentious fight over the Mascot name change. Those who graduated as Quakers will always be Quakers but the ones since the change will have Lightening as their Mascot and be known by that.

In 2015 Franklin had a new "student/friend/staff member" named Archie join the school. Everyone knew Archie, a therapy dog with a full-time job at Franklin. He was the school's most beloved staff member and was once voted prom king — though later disqualified. Archie had a staff ID badge, a place in the yearbook and a schedule. In the mornings, students from the intensive skills class took him for a walk. He was used to help students with anger management issues. "There is this animal instinct that he has where it's almost like he knows there is something that may be troubling you, may be concerning you, and he takes it upon himself to do his job.". Archie passed away two years ago. There is a picture of him in the main hall.

We thought you might like to read some of the history of Franklin that you might not have known before.

# Judson Taylor makes a distinguished career in academia

The alumni association implemented this Distinguished Alum Citation in 2011 to highlight alums that have shown significant accomplishments since leaving FHS. These awards are to honor individuals for their personal and professional contributions.

In this issue of the Post, we are highlighting one of the 2015 recipients.

Judson Taylor graduated from Franklin class of 1956 and graduated from University of Oregon 4 years later in education.

His first teaching position was in the Coos Bay school system. He then received his Masters in Education and moved to California. His doctorate came from Arizona State (Educational Psychology) in 1969 with an emphasis in secondary education, social studies, and counseling and guidance. He also taught graduate courses in research and evaluation and advanced teaching strategy and became



an experienced higher educator leader and evaluator.

Taylor was Vice Chancellor and provost for academic affairs at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls for

three years. In 1995 he then moved on to the State University of New York, Cortland, where he served for eight years as President.

Throughout his time at SUNY he strongly advocated for intercollegiate athletics at their campus. He oversaw a major renovation of the campus athletic facilities, was the driving force behind the College building its \$18 million Stadium complex and was the visionary who brought the 2002 Empire State Games to the campus. Taylor also endorsed the addition of intercollegiate women's sports for the Cortland students.

From 1970-92, he was a member of the faculty at California State University at Dominguez Hills. While there, he served as a professor of educational psychology, Graduate Education Department chair, Director of learning assistance and testing, and Dean of the School of Education. Taylor has had extensive international

experiences as well. In 1969-70, he was a school psychologist with Department of Defense schools in Japan. He was a Fulbright Scholar in Lisbon in 1979, working with Portugal's Ministry of Education and Culture. Taylor served as an educational evaluation consultant for a USAID/SanDiego State project in Brazil from 1974-76 and received a Foreign Service Award from San Diego State for his work. In 1983, Taylor served as a visiting professor at the Boston University World Bank project in Lisbon.

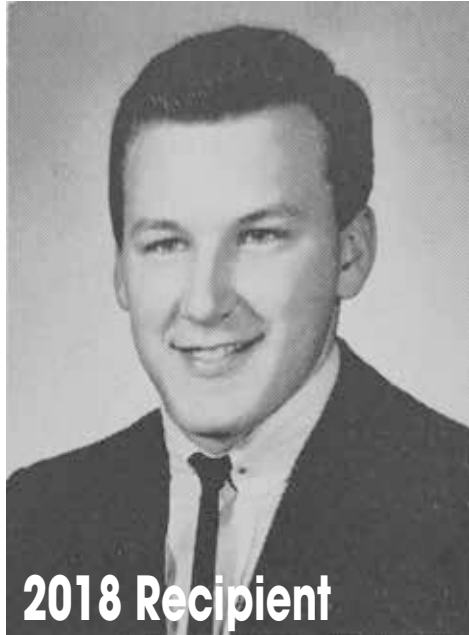
Judson Taylor is now retired and living back in the Pacific Northwest.

The federal government sent he and his wife to several foreign countries to teach these concepts to educators in those countries. He also was honored to give the commencement address at the University of Oregon's school of education graduation after he retired and moved back to the Pacific Northwest

# Garry Lee served his country in Vietnam

Garry Lee, Class of '65, was awarded the Order of the Kite posthumously in May of 2018. Garry was serving as President of the Alumni Association Board the time of his death. He had been involved the Alumni Association since 2013. He was a strong advocate for maintaining the Quaker name and attended many meetings with the School Board speaking in favor of maintaining our mascot name. As we all know, we lost out and the name was eventually changed to Lightning.

Garry was a Marine Corps veteran. He loved the United States Marine Corps and according to his son, Garry would often go up to fellow USM vets if he noticed a bumper sticker or t-shirt, to shake their hand and talk about their service. On October 25, 1968, while serving in Vietnam, he received a Meritorious Combat Promotion to Sergeant. From his letter of recommendation from



his commanding officer it noted his exceptional, noteworthy, and commendatory performance of duty. "His resourcefulness in adapting to extreme adverse conditions coupled with a genuine 'can-do' spirit set the

example for all those concerned. His continued endurance, self-discipline, military presence and personal relations are qualities that were an inspiration for all who know and served with him." Gary's son Gudmund said that the commanding officer's commendation words were written when Gary was only 21 years old, and that truer words were never written about his father and they remained true throughout his life.

After his tour of duty in Vietnam, he returned home and worked at Hoffman Construction company for over 20 years. He then moved to Anchorage Alaska in 1991 to pursue a teaching career with students in the 4th and 6th grades. He returned to Portland in 1998 and accepted a position in Vancouver where he taught 6th grade gifted children classes until he retired. One of his greatest achievements of his teaching career was earning the Vancouver Teacher of the Year award in 2011.

# Judy Orem lives a full life in service to others

Judy McAllister Orem, '62 2018 recipient of the Order of the Kite

Family history at Franklin with both parents, aunts and uncles graduating from Franklin.

Lewis and Clark College BS '66 and Portland State University MS. Married Frank Orem in 1965. Two offspring and two grandchildren.

Judy served on the Oregon Department of Transportation Advisory Committee, The Portland Public Schools Transportation advisory committee and lobbied for school bus safety regulations. She worked with Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts. Judy twice chaired the Sierra Club National Environmental Education Committee. She did a National News letter to connect the Chapter and Group leaders. She has also held several positions at her church including recently as chair of the Health Ministries Committee.

In '95 she was diagnosed the CML and given 2 to 5 years. Judy worked with the



Leukemia and Lymphoma Society (LLS) to form a support group for Patients on the Phase I trial for Gleevec at OHSU starting in 1999. She wrote a monthly news letter called the STI Gazette which was sent to a

couple hundred patients.

Judy twice reviewed grant proposals for the Dept of Defense for CML.

She has been written about in: The Magic Bullet by Dr Dan Vasella, in The Language of Life: DNA and the Revolution in Personalized Medicine by Dr Francis Collins and The Philadelphia Chromosome by Jessica Wapner. She told her story on all the National TV stations, on websites, and spoken before groups to tell her story of the remarkable success the breakthrough in Cancer studies are providing to CML patients. Judy has been a First Connection volunteer for the LLS, where she encourages people to take charge of their treatment and not let the cancer take charge of them.

Judy attended a couple FHSAA meeting in 2010 and was asked if she wanted to be Treasurer or Data Base Secretary. She has been in the DBS job since then, now managing a list of 18,000 alums.

## Mal and Vi Watt
