FHSAA is a non-profit organization that formed to "engage in activities which advance educational opportunities for the students of Franklin High School and which prepares them to be contributing and responsible members of society". Currently our paid membership is 284, that is 201 less members since our Fall 2024 Alumni Post! About 9 years ago, we had over 800 paid members. We need to get those numbers back to that level. Membership dues are our single funding for the Alumni Post. Which currently costs about \$11,000 per issue. Please consider sending in \$20.00 so we can continue to

Annual Picnic 2025 scheduled for July 11

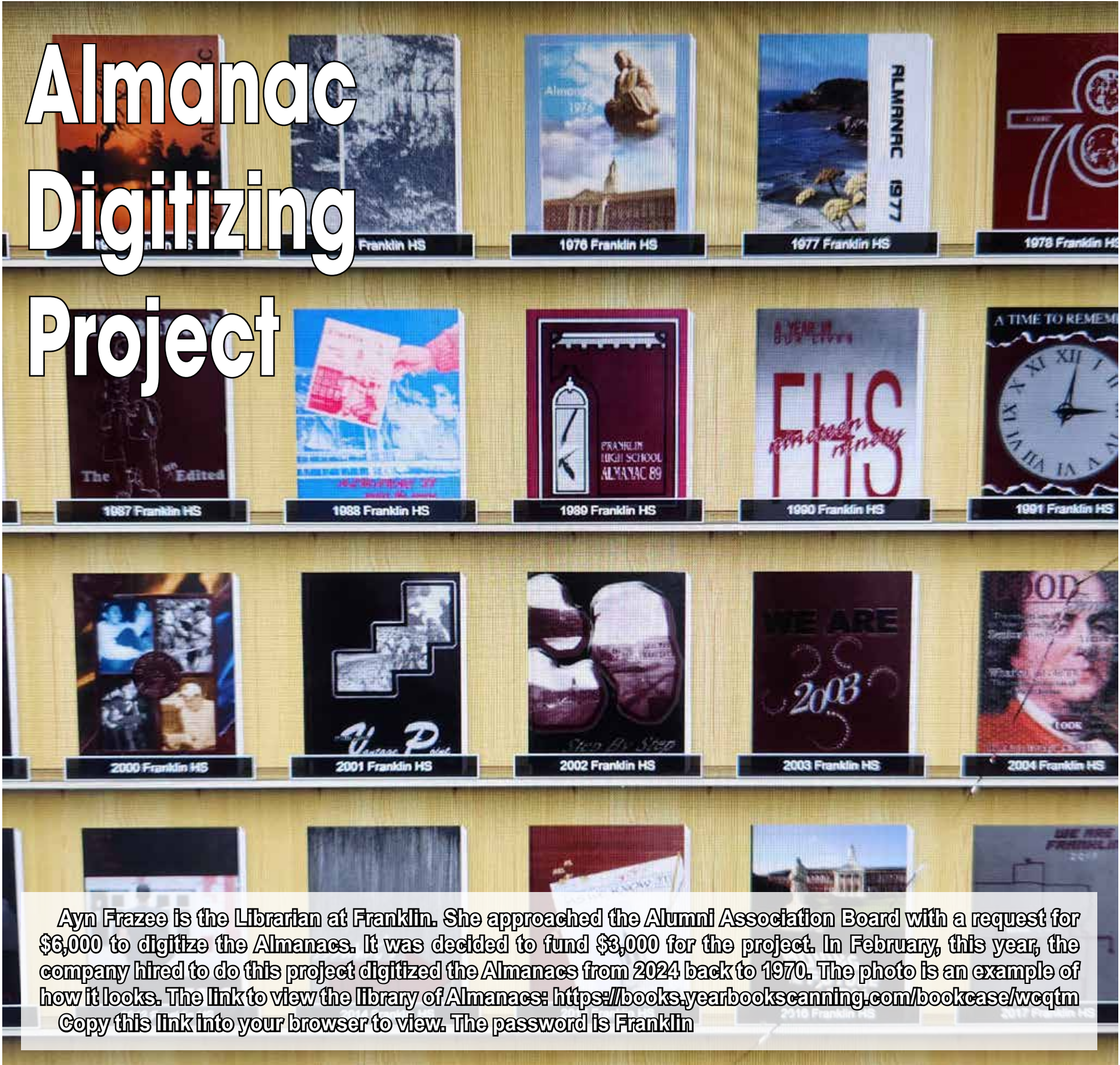
Hi to all!

Organizational materials bought to re-imagine classroom

Dear FHSAA grant supporters,
Thank you so much for your contributions to the alumni grant funds. Last spring I decided that I wanted to reimagine my classroom structure and try a new strategy of self pacing. I knew one potential barrier to student success in this model would be a disorganized classroom, so I mentally prepared myself that the cost of supplies would be out of pocket. One of my fellow science teachers encouraged me to apply for the grant, and I’m so glad that I did.
I used grant funds to purchase bins to house materials for each lesson in a unit so students can quickly find what they need without asking for help. I got headphone connectors so students can work together, listening to my lecture videos or doing activities on the computer. Finally, I bought reams of paper in different colors so I could color code lesson assessments. These are simple things, but I would have settled for something lesser if I were using my own funds, and students appreciate these structures. It has helped them gain good habits of independence and allowed me to focus

on working with small groups of supporting individuals.

New SD Cards, cameras bought for photo program

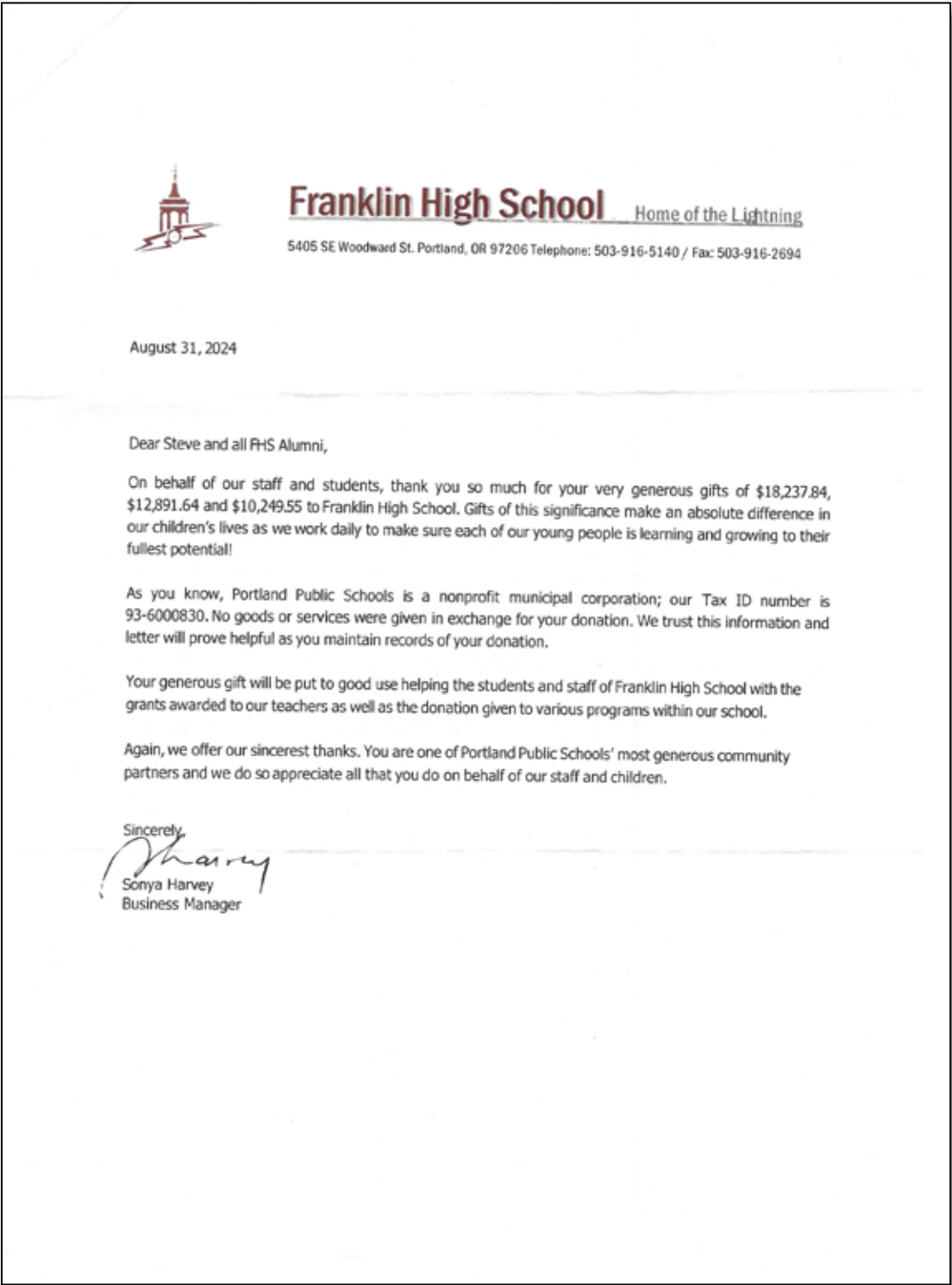

FHSAA Financial Facts

Alumni Donations Trending Up!

If year-end projections for this fiscal year's financial results prove accurate, alumni donations in all categories will show an upward trend over last year!

After a low of \$33,343 in overall donations in fiscal year 2023/24, this year's number looks to come in at around \$44,631, a \$10,000+ increase. Although a healthy increase, it does not compare to a high of \$53,444 in donations brought in during the 2022/23 fiscal year.

The good news! There's still time. The chart shown below, along with the accompanying spreadsheet provides a visual of the last four fiscal years and the projected numbers for 2024/25. Even though the overall period of analysis shows a downward trend, the current year shows a healthy upward trend over last year.

Note: 2024/25 numbers are projected base on the first five months of the fiscal year. None of the numbers include any donations made to the Class Challenge, Annual Picnic, or Luncheon.

Analysis
Membership dues has remained relatively consistent, ranging from a low of \$6,317 in fiscal year 2023/24 to a high of \$9,111 in fiscal year 2022/23. However, this year's projected number of \$9,266 could possibly surpass 2022/23 if projections prove correct. Also, the increase in dues from \$15 to \$20, implemented in

the 2024/25 fiscal year, is a considerable factor in the increased number. This change resulted in an estimated added amount of \$966, so far. The average membership dues over the past five years averaged \$8,253 per year.

FHSAA donations have been up and down over the past five years, but have followed the overall trend. Trends for these types of donations can be skewed based on one or two large donations, which is the case in the 2020/21 numbers.

School donations have always been a favorite among FHS Alums. These are

donations earmarked for specific school programs based on your (the Alumni's) requests. Some of these school programs had a personal impact on the life of the alum and many contribute to their favorite program year after year. Overall donations to this category have exceeded the other two categories, except for FHSAA donations made in fiscal year 2020/21, in every fiscal year.

Again, if projected numbers for this fiscal year prove correct, the Franklin High School Alumni Association is moving in the right direction.

Since our last-years' distributions to the requested grant list, we have heard back from several of the teacher/recipients. Good news, the money was used as they had requested. Note: we did not receive any hand-written notes from the individual students, rather, a general thank you from the instructor or teacher. Sometimes we get visits and explanations in person, from the instructors or teachers, and can ask specific questions, without jeopardizing

any privacy issues. Things have changed, but not everything in this world is falling apart! There are still positive people doing positive things, and FHS has some wonderfully positive students, teachers and staff.

Dear Friends, my letter is coming to a close, and I hope you have a great day. Have fun and be funny! Delight in laughter and share good news. Thank you for your support of the Franklin High School Alumni Association, and The Franklin High School Beloved Community.

Franklin football program has goal to raise \$10,000

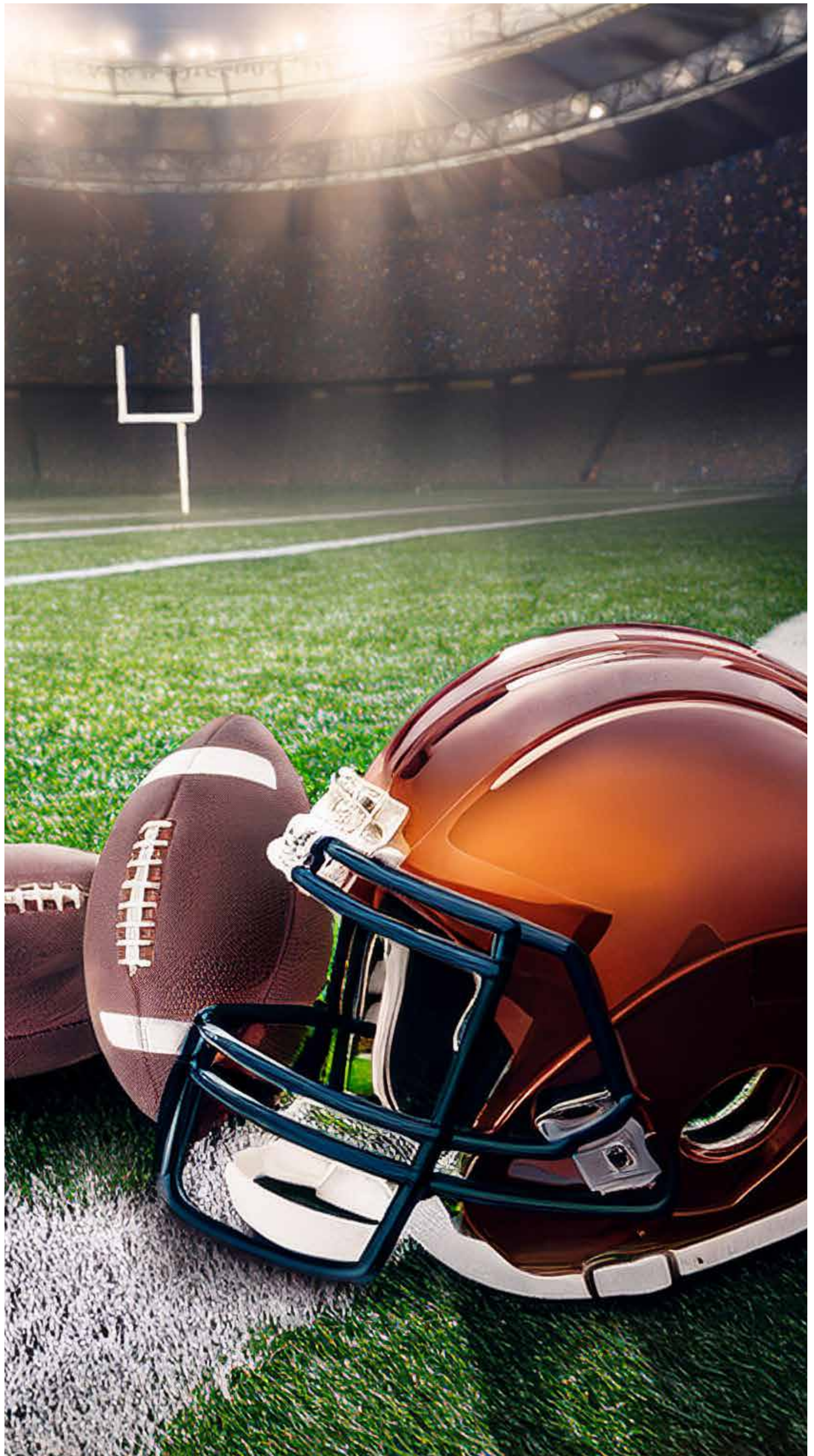
At Franklin, we believe football is more than a sport, it's a catalyst for community building. The best way to build community is to participate in it! We are launching a fundraising campaign and need your help.

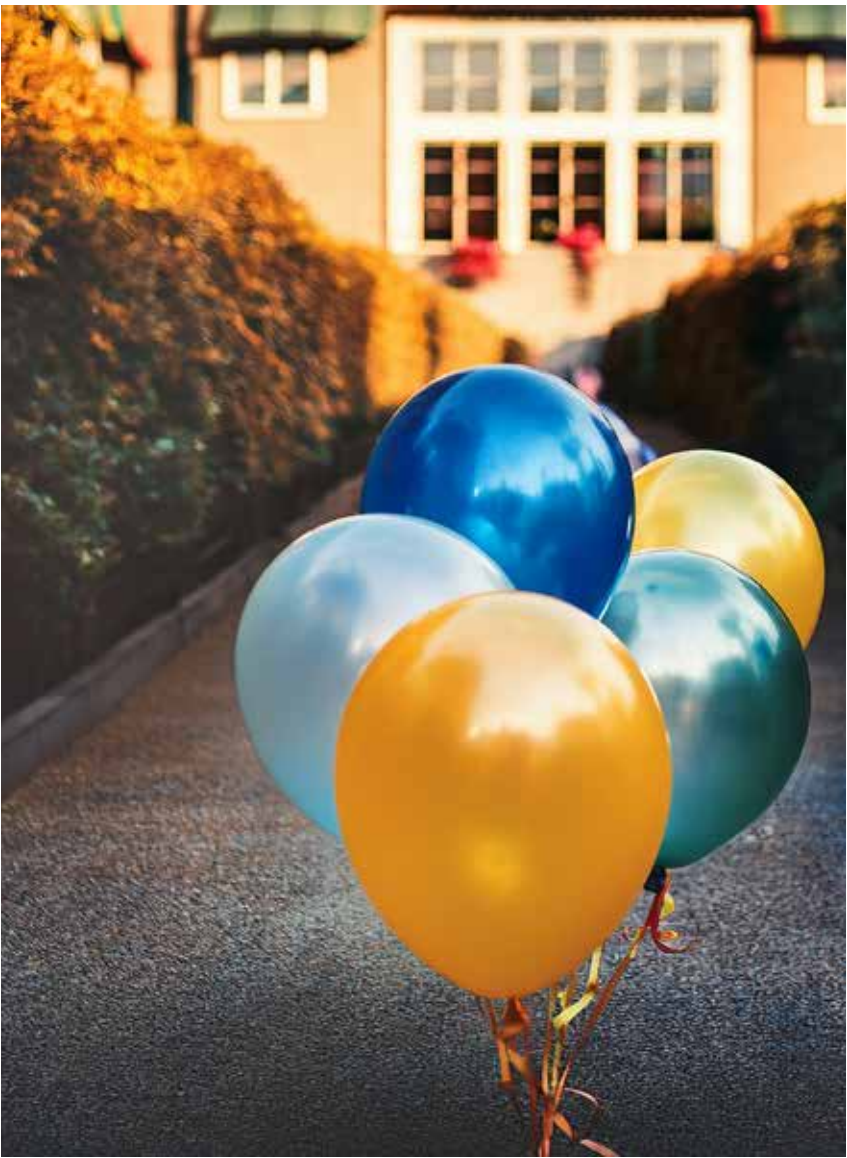
